Dogs are Safest at the End of Your Leash



Dogs are not allowed to be loose, unless they are on your property or in a designated off-leash area. A map of these sites can be found on the City of Edmonton Website.

North Glenora does not have any designated off leash areas within its boundaries.

Dogs must always be on a leash when on public property and should be contained in a secure yard or building when on your property. Dogs are not allowed on school grounds, sports fields, playgrounds and golf courses.

This includes the Coronation School playground, and the North Glenora park area. The fine for violating this bylaw is \$100.

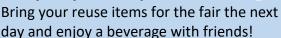

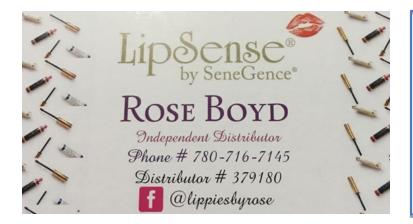

It's almost seed starting time! Plants, like tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, cucumbers, melons, and squash, need a head-start of about 6 weeks before they can be planted outside. If you're new to gardening or don't have much of a yard, think small to start; you truly don't need a lot of space to plant a productive and beautiful little garden. My husband and I lived in an apartment with a tiny balcony in Montreal before moving here and I loved turning it into an edible oasis every spring. With a few rectangular planters (at least 12 inches deep), some hanging baskets, and a bit of creativity, a wide variety of plants including dwarf tomato varieties, cucumbers, herbs, strawberries, salad greens, and edible flowers like nasturtiums, absolutely thrive. Let's start some seeds!

Many people use peat pellets to start their seeds, but there are a few good reasons to **avoid using peat** in the garden:

- Peat bogs are carbon sinks. That means that they are very effective at holding carbon dioxide which otherwise would contribute to global warming, so it's best not to disturb them.
- Peat bogs store and filter around 10% of the world's freshwater.
- Peat is mined using a strip mining technique that harvests a depth of more than 20 cm per year, but peat grows at a rate of only 1 mm per year.
- Peat bogs are home to many important species of plants and animals.

As an alternative, I like to make my own seed starting pots.

How to Make Newspaper Seed Starting Pots:

- Get out your seeds, a bag of potting mix, a bunch of old newspaper, a bucket filled a third of the way with water, and a small cup (1.5-2" diameter) or yogurt container with straight sides (rather than tapered or rounded).
- Take the newspaper (like the size of the Metro) and fold it lengthwise in half, and then in half again. The height of the folded paper should be around 2.5".
- Dip the full length of newspaper in the bucket until the paper is wet, but not soaked.
- Wrap the paper around the bottom half of your small, straight-edged cup so that you are leaving about half of the width of your paper hanging off the bottom of the cup. Don't wrap the paper too tightly, or it will be difficult to remove your newspaper seed starting pot from the cup.
- Fold the paper in towards the centre of the bottom of the cup, starting with the seam of the wrapped paper.

- Press the top of the cup down into a surface to flatten the bottom of the newspaper. The newly made pot should slide nicely away from the cup.
- Repeat this process for the number of pots you are planning for, and set them aside to dry.
- Once dry, fill each of your newspaper seed starting pots with soil almost to the top and give the soil a good watering (you may need to top up the soil again after the water settles the soil).
- Poke a hole in the middle of the pot and plant your seed!

These little pots will last the 6 weeks until you need to transplant to the garden as long as you got a good overlap of paper on the bottom of your paper pot. The best part is that when transplanting time comes, you can dig a hole the size of the pot and plant the whole works in the garden! The roots will burst right through the bottom of the newspaper pot.

**A couple of notes: It helps to have a large, waterproof tray such as the lid of a large Rubbermaid container so that you can place all the pots in the tray and move them to the sunniest location in your house and be able to water them easily.

Don't use a cup you love because the ink from the newspaper can be really tough to get off afterwards (can you tell I'm speaking from experience?)

This is a great activity for kids. My daughter loves making the pots while my son likes to fill them with dirt and everyone loves the part where you get to plant the seed:)

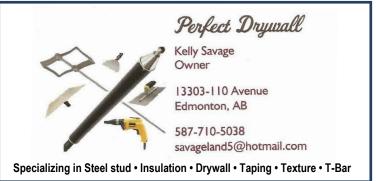
