WELCOME TO THE NORTH GLENORA RAIN GARDEN!

In early spring 2023, NGCL will begin work on our rain garden with anticipated completion by summer 2023.

What is a Rain Garden?

A rain garden is a collection of plants, soil, and rock that mimic systems in nature to collect and filter rainwater that would otherwise run into stormwater systems. The North Glenora Rain Garden will be a beautiful meeting place for residents to enjoy while it demonstrates the use of alternative landscaping to divert and harness rainwater. The garden will consist of two rain garden basin areas that will capture and filter water from the community's rink shack roof. These gardens will feature a variety of native plants that are naturally adapted to both wet and dry conditions. These plants can effectively filter pollutants from stormwater, are beautiful, and provide habitat for important pollinators. The rest of the area will be planted with alternative landscaping plants to demonstrate to residents how they can replace conventional turf in their own yards with a variety of plants that utilize water more efficiently and require less maintenance overall.

Become a Rain Garden Steward!

You will be invited to a number of sessions to gain a deeper understanding of this project and become familiar with the plants that are growing there, helping them to grow to their fullest potential. Maintenance sessions will be overseen by experts who will teach stewards to identify plants, weed the area and gain hands-on experience in rain garden land management.

This project is being funded by EcoAction, the City of Edmonton, EPCOR, and the Alberta Low Impact Development Partnership (ALIDP) and will be the first of its kind in Edmonton!

- Build an all-weather outdoor whiteboard for outdoor classroom.





GARBAGE DAY. THERE'S AN APP FOR THAT.



Many will have heard the tag line 'there's an app for that', referring to the many applications for smart phones and tablets. With that in mind the City of Edmonton developed an app for Garbage Day, available for both Android and IOS phones and tablets.

The handiest item on the app shows you when pick up happens and which containers to put out. If you choose to receive notifications, you'll get a notice for your pick up day and special pick-ups such as yard waste and Christmas trees. Handy dandy.

What I found really useful is the 'What Goes Where' button. If you want to know if something goes in the garbage bin or in recycling, just pop it into the search window to get your answer. Did you know pill bottles aren't recyclable? Even with that notorious recycling symbol on the bottom? If you'd like to get the app it's on the App Store or Google Play store—just search for Edmonton WasteWise.


