

RINK SHACK ROOF REPAIRS UPDATE



Hi neighbours! You have probably been wondering what's been going on with the rink shack roof. Home Depot Westmount came out March 23rd and provided the materials and labour required to complete the rink shack roof repairs.

Once they started the work, they realized we had a problem with pigeons roosting in the rafters. Because of that they closed off the space between the outside and the rafters using chicken wire so that no more pigeons nest inside this space, and have also replaced most of the soffits. Repairs were paused to accommodate pigeons that are currently nesting.

Battle River Wildlife Management is working to ensure the babies fledge while deterring other pigeons from making their homes there, using ultrasonic sound emitters and other methods. Once the baby pigeons are out of the nests, we'll finish closing up the roof space.

A big thank you to Home Depot Westmount and Battle River Wildlife Management for helping make this project a success!



GARDENING IN THE SHADE



We live in a neighbourhood with lots of mature, gigantic trees, and that's great! It's one of the things that so many of us love about our community.

However, this beautiful feature can present some challenges for those of us wishing to grow our own vegetables. Trees create shade and growing veggies requires 6–8 hours of direct sunlight per day. So what can you plant if you have a yard, porch, or balcony that doesn't get the required amount of light? Below is a list of vegetables that can grow in light shade (2–4 hours sunlight) to partial shade (4–6 hours sunlight).

Light Shade 2-4 hours sunlight

- Asparagus
- Brussel Sprouts
- Swiss Chard
- Radishes
- Parsnips
- Lettuce
- Cabbage
- Watercress
- Spinach
- Collard Greens
- Kale

Partial Shade 4-6 hours sunlight


- Potatoes
- Beets
- Carrots
- Bush beans
- Summer Squash
- Adapted varieties of Bush Tomatoes
- Leeks and onions
- Some herbs including mint, chives, cilantro, and parsley

Growing plants that can thrive with lower levels of sunlight allows us to enjoy both our trees and our gardens.
