

We had a great Spring Sustainability Fair on Sunday, June 4th!







The event featured a number of stations by a variety of organizations in and around Edmonton. There was a clothing exchange and clothing repair clinic, a bicycle repair station hosted by United Cycle, as well as information and interactive displays by our neighbourhood Master Composter, Solar Alberta, Relay Education, Edmonton Urban Coyote Project, Edmonton Tool Library, Edmonton and Area Land Trust, and the City of Edmonton Pest Management Lab.

One of the goals of the event was to launch the construction phase of our new community rain garden demonstration site. Alberta Low Impact Development Partnership, who designed the rain garden, was at the event to share information and engage with the community around this unique and exciting project.





There were also crafts for kids, bicycle games and commuting information by our very own neighbourhood Bike Mayor, and fresh fruit was served along with popcorn and drinks provided by Square One Coffee. PLANNING AND TRANSPORTATION UPDATE



City of Edmonton Proposed New Zoning Bylaws

Zoning determines what can be built where. It sets the rules for where new buildings should go, what types of buildings they can be and what types of businesses and activities can happen on a property. The City has extended the deadline for the new zoning bylaw feedback until July 30.

ALLEY RENEWAL CONSTRUCTION

The alley construction currently taking place in our neighbourhood is the correction of deficiencies in the work completed in the summers of 2021 and 2022.

Construction will resolve City of Edmonton identified deficiencies/concerns so that alleys meet City specifications, at the cost of the contractor.

Only selected alley locations are affected and residents in those areas will be provided with advance notice. Work is scheduled to be completed by August 1, 2023.

Call for volunteers!

We have a casino in August and we need your help. Casinos only come around once every 2 years and the funds we generate keep our hall up and running, including maintenance and repairs, equipment for programs or events, guest speaker expenses for events such Community Days and so much more!

What can I expect if I volunteer?

Get to know your neighbours. Generally this is a lot of fun! It's a great way to volunteer for the community if you aren't able to make a longer time commitment.

Do I need a criminal record check or any other documents?

No, but for those in the upper positions (volunteer General Manager, Banker, Count Room Supervisor) you will need to fill out the volunteer form with your contact info, place and date of birth, and whether you have been charged with a criminal offence. No other forms are needed.

Do I need experience?

Definitely not. You do not have to know anything about casinos other than the location. Those in the volunteer Cashier cash cage will be trained in dealing with chips and money for the payouts. At least three people are always in the cash cage room to verify counts and provide support.

What are the hours?

- 1. 9:30 am to 7:00 pm
- 2. 6:30 pm to 3:15 am
- **3.** 11 pm to 3:15 am

If you can only volunteer for a half shift, talk to Neil in the contact information below.

Are meals included when I work the casino?

YES all meals are included.

What if I don't have a car or don't drive?

Contact Neil and he will make arrangements for you.

I have other questions or barriers to volunteering that aren't on this list.


