IT'S BACK TO School time



As school doors open, traffic gets a little heavier on our streets. People are back from holidays, school buses and public transit are on regular routes, and more people are walking, cycling or driving to school.

To help with the transition and share the roads safely, read our safety tips. Help everyone stay safe this school year!

1) Observe School Zone Speeds

Children crossing the road on their way to and from school can easily get distracted and step into harm's way. Slowing down and being vigilant is crucial to keeping kids safe.

2) Obey the Crossing Guard

A crossing guard is there to keep children safe. If you come up to a set of lights, and the light turns green, but the crossing guard still says stop, follow his/her direction and not the traffic light. There might be a child still crossing the street that you can't see.

3) Watch for Darting Children

Kids are small and easily distracted, and for drivers, this can create dangerous situations on the roads. You never know when a small child might step out from between parked cars or off a sidewalk. Your awareness and fast reflexes may be needed to prevent an accident.

4) School Buses

Most mishaps take place outside the bus. Make sure children don't arrive too early at the bus stop where they can wander or get into mischief. Ensure children wait well away from the road and stay back until the school bus makes a full stop and the doors open. Explain that they must walk at least three metres (10 feet) away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them. When driving your car near a school bus please note that extra caution is needed.

NORTH GLENORA OPEN MIC



PLANNING AND TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

Our community continues to see activity encouraging growth in North Glenora! Here are some updates as of this month:

- 1. Verona Developments moves forward! The City of Edmonton has issued a development permit for a 35 residential unit, 4-storey structure with one commercial unit on the corner of 135 St and 109 Ave. Excavation is underway for a 36 parking stall underground parkade, with construction continuing throughout the winter season.
- 2. On the corner of 107 Ave. and Groat Rd., the old Texaco Gas Station location, is now seeing some activity. The company has received a permit to construct exterior alterations on the vacant site, installing a temporary shoring system for environmental remediation.
- 3. Regency Patio Homes continues to move forward having resolving underground work with Epcor. Regency adjusted its schedule to a March 2024 completion.
- Our community will have another walkable grocery store! The existing space located at 10720 – 142 Street is being converted into a new grocery store, known as Freson Bros Glenora Circle. Remember to continue supporting the wonderful established shops and services adjacent to this new development.

6. T5M Connect is now complete and fully leased, housing new neighbours we welcome to our community!

THE VILLAGE GREEN

BOULEVARD GARDENS



The City of Edmonton is embracing the practice of gardening on our boulevards and using this space for to beautify neighbourhoods. Many people have been doing this for years so it's nice to see that the City is now encouraging it!

Boulevard gardening can provide ecological benefits by providing habitat for important pollinator species, decreasing the amount of fertilizer and water people may use to maintain these strips of land, and slowing the flow of stormwater to sewage drains.

How To Begin Boulevard Gardening:

1. Fill out the online form to get your permit: https://www.edmonton.ca/residential_ neighbourhoods/gardens_lawns_trees/boulevardgardening

The form or declaration acts as a permit for simple garden plans and only takes a minute to fill out. There is no fee!

2. Make sure you leave space between your garden and any City trees that may be on the boulevard. Here is a link to the tree protection guidelines: <u>https://www. edmonton.ca/residential_neighbourhoods/gardens_</u> lawns_trees/public-tree-permit#stack80991

- 3. Choose the location for your boulevard garden taking into consideration fixed objects and intersection allowances. You need to make sure your garden is at least 1.5 m from fixed objects like fire hydrants and utility boxes. Gardens also need to be set back from intersections. Five metres from the corner of an uncontrolled intersection and 10 m from the corner of a controlled intersection.
- 4. **Design your garden!** Late summer to early fall is a great time to establish a new garden. Consider using native perennials as they require little maintenance, are the best food for local pollinators, and are of course beautiful!

*A note on digging. You are allowed to dig down 2 inches and add 2 inches of fresh soil or compost for a total of a 4 inch depth in your boulevard garden.

If you want to establish a more elaborate garden on your boulevard you will need a License of Occupation. This is still a pretty simple process, but there is an annual fee.
