#### **Details**

The season will start January 7, 2024 and will run through to March 3, 2024, Sunday mornings between 10 am to 12 pm at the North Glenora Community outdoor ice rink. The cost is \$75 and includes 9x1 hour coaching sessions, hockey equipment (as available) and hot chocolate.





## We are Hiring a Rink Coordinator

#### **Duties include:**





# COMMUNITY GARDEN CONSTRUCTION

You'll notice that phase one of the community garden has been constructed on the northeast corner of the community hall! Nine 8' x 4' raised garden beds and one large in-ground bed\* were established on September 30th by a dedicated and incredibly hard-working group of volunteers!



North Glenora has been talking about adding a community garden to the neighbourhood for a very long time, so it is great to see this space becoming a reality!

Raised beds will be available to rent for Spring, 2024. Watch for announcements on how to apply!

The in-ground bed will be a community growing space where we can plant together for each other.

The North Glenora Sustainability Committee would also like to thank **Sustainable Food Edmonton** for supporting this project.

\*The in-ground bed is being established using a method known as "sheet mulching". Cardboard has been placed underneath the soil and will kill the sod over the winter allowing for easier digging in the spring. Layers of compost and more soil will be added to create great soil conditions for growing food!

# **RAIN GARDEN**

Thank you so much to the incredible group of volunteers that planted, weeded and watered our new rain garden and resilient landscaping demonstration during the summer and fall, 2023. The plants have been so well-cared for and are becoming nicely established.

Please remember, this is a communal space. Feel free to wander through the garden whenever you please! Do take caution around the new plants for the first couple of years, so they are not trampled.

The North Glenora Sustainability Committee plans to add seating in the near future so that residents can meet up here, relax, and enjoy the rain garden together.

# **RADON GAS**



Radon is an invisible, odourless, radioactive gas that is a product of the breakdown of naturally occurring uranium and thorium – common components in the soil, rock, and water. Radon gas dissipates quickly in the outdoors, but the gas can seep into cracks and gaps in houses and accumulate there – especially in basements.

Exposure to radon gas over long periods of time poses a serious health risk to people and is the second leading cause of lung cancer. It's estimated that in Canada, 3,200 people per year die from lung cancer caused by radon exposure.

#### So what can we do about it?

Test your house. You can hire a company to come to your home and test for radon or you can do it yourself with a radon test kit. A test kit can be purchased on Amazon for between \$40–\$70. If you decide to go this route, set up your test in the fall and winter months when your windows are closed most of the time for the most accurate results. It's important to note that radon levels can vary widely from house to house so even if your neighbour has tested and has no issues, your house could still have elevated radon levels.

I was shocked when the results of our tests were emailed to us stating that our radon levels were over the acceptable level of 200 Bq/m3 set out by Health Canada. The World Health Organization sets the acceptable level even lower, at 100 Bq/m3.

After a lot of research and three different quotes, we decided to have a radon mitigation pump installed by Radon Gas Removal Systems (https://www.radongasremoval.ca). They were efficient and professional and had the pump installed very quickly. Pumps range from between \$1500 and \$3000. The gas levels dropped quickly and are below the recommended levels now. The kids' play area is downstairs as well as our guest room and we all do spend quite a bit of time downstairs especially in the winter. If you do require a pump but it's not in your budget at the moment, we found levels could be cut pretty much in half by opening the windows twice daily for ten minutes at a time. It's a bit cold in the winter, but a cheap and relatively effective fix. However, please do this at your own discretion.
