## SLEDDING SAFETY





Emergency Medical Services

**Emergency Medical Services** would like to remind parents and children about a few toboggan/sledding safety tips.

Injuries may result from collisions with stationary objects on the hill, such as trees, poles, rocks, or even collisions with other people. Unprotected falls can also result in more serious injury if you lose control at high speeds. However, everyone can be safe and have fun on the toboggan hill by following these reminders.

#### **Sledding Equipment**

- Always ensure your toboggan, or sledding device, is in good repair. Inspect it for any damaged or missing parts before each use;
- Be certain the operator is fully capable of staying in control of the sled at all times;
- Wear a ski helmet designed for use in cold weather and high speeds.

#### **Hazards**

- Avoid hills that are too steep or icy;
- Choose hills free of all obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, benches, or fences;
- Beware of loose scarves or clothing containing drawstrings, which could present a strangulation hazard if they become caught or snagged;
- Look out for others. Move quickly to the side after finishing a run and stay to the side of the sliding path when walking up the hill;
- Children should be supervised by an adult; try not to toboggan alone;
- Sledding at night is not advised.

#### Plan ahead

- Anticipate weather changes and plan accordingly;
- Wear warm, insulating layers closer to the body, and wind/waterproof layers on the outside;
- Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to exchange wet garments for dry ones;
- Take breaks out of the cold to warm up;
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the finger tips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose are vulnerable.
   If frost bite has occurred, treat it by first getting out of the cold environment, or at least sheltered from any wind-chill:
- Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand over it, or by placing the affected part in warm – not hot – water, until re-warmed.

## EDMONTON HUMANE SOCIETY FOSTER PROGRAM


## **FOSTER AND SAVE A LIFE!**



Foster volunteers play a vital role for the Edmonton Humane Society. These volunteers open their hearts and homes to animals who are not yet ready for adoption. Animals who require foster care may be too young for adoption, sick or injured, need specific behaviour therapy, or perhaps just a quiet place to lay their heads. Some pets are very stressed at the shelter and do much better in a home environment, allowing their true personalities to come out. The foster program also opens up space in the shelter, freeing kennels to house and care for even more animals.

Foster volunteers provide temporary care in their homes until the animals are ready for adoption. The length of stay in a foster home can vary anywhere from two weeks to two months. The EHS provides all supplies and veterinary care; foster parents provide much needed TLC and basic care such as feeding, exercise, grooming, socialization, and occasional medication administration (full instructions provided).

# PLANNING AND TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

New District Plan: We recently learned about proposed District Plans and changes to zoning along corridors. North Glenora is included in the Central District. One proposed change, for example, is portions of 107 and 111 Ave will be designated as secondary corridors, and may include mid-rise buildings of mixed use (residential and commercial spaces). More information can be found in the <u>City Plan</u> (pages 97–104) describing how communities will be zoned according to nodes and corridors. Additionally, the City has provided a <u>District Planning Frequently Asked Questions</u> document.

Emergency vehicle access issues: Our committee is investigating emergency vehicles accessibility in our neighbourhood, focusing on narrower streets with parking on both sides of the street.

Changes to community sandboxes: Community
Sandboxes will be centralized to Coronation Eco Centre
(11440–143 St) and Maintenance Yard (14320–114
Ave). The sandboxes at the Maintenance Yard are located
OUTSIDE the fence. Please bring your own container.






## HARD-TO-RECYCLE ITEMS









erraCycle Recycling Program Examples

**TerraCycle** is a fantastic not-for-profit organization that is dedicated to eliminating the idea of waste by collecting and recycling the hard-to-recycle things.

If an item isn't locally recyclable, it's usually because collecting and processing it costs more than the value of the resulting raw material. **TerraCycle** works with concerned retailers, companies, and stakeholders who fund them to carry out the recycling process. So if the WasteWise App advises the user to put an item in the garbage, it might be worth checking out **TerraCycle**. They have free and paid services and also have stations set up at some retailers. For example, the Staples at Unity Square accepts markers and pens for recycling, and some dental offices have **TerraCycle** collection bins for toothbrushes and toothpaste containers.

Just a few of the hard-to-recycle items that **TerraCycle** accepts for its free recycling program:

- Razor blades and handles
- Coffee bags
- Brita filters
- Squeeze snack pouches
- Beauty product containers
- Toothbrushes and oral care containers
