



SAFETY UPDATE ENCAMPMENTS AND UNHOUSED INDIVIDUALS UPDATE.

Encampment Response Process

Citizens are encouraged to call 311 or use the 311 App to report encampments. City park rangers are notified and investigate an encampment(s) within 3–5 days of the initial 311 report.

Encampment Response Team

The Encampment Response Team (ERT) is a partnership between:

- The City of Edmonton
- Homeward Trust
- Boyle Street Community Services
- Bissell Centre
- Edmonton Police Service

The ERT responds to low-risk homeless encampments across the city and coordinates closures and clean-up. Its goal is to support the safety and well-being of people staying in encampments, housing them directly from encampments before enforcement and clean-up action is taken.

City Peace Officers and EPS take the lead in responding more quickly to high-risk encampments. Our shared priority is the safety of both people experiencing homelessness and the surrounding community.

It is important that residents of North Glenora are reporting these issues to not only the Safety Director of the Community League but also the city of Edmonton and other appropriate authorities.

THE VILLAGE GREEN

STARTING SEEDS FOR GARDENS BIG AND SMALL

It's almost seed starting time! Plants, like tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, cucumbers, melons, and squash, need a head-start of about 6 weeks before they can be planted outside.



How do I start?

If you're new to gardening or don't have much of a yard, think small to start; you truly don't need a lot of space to plant a productive and beautiful little garden. With a few rectangular planters (at least 12 inches deep), some hanging baskets, and a bit of creativity, a wide variety of plants including dwarf tomato varieties, cucumbers, herbs, strawberries, salad greens, and edible flowers like nasturtiums will thrive. Let's start some seeds!

Many people use peat pellets to start their seeds, but there are a few good reasons to avoid using peat in the garden:

- Peat bogs are carbon sinks. That means that they are very effective at holding carbon dioxide which otherwise would contribute to global warming, so it's best not to disturb them.
- Peat bogs store and filter around 10% of the world's freshwater
- Peat is mined using a strip mining technique that harvests a depth of more than 20 cm per year, but peat only grows at a rate of only 1 mm per year.
- Peat bogs are home to many important species of plants and animals

As an alternative, I like to make my own newspaper seed starting pots which are then filled with a good organic soil mix and can be popped right into the garden when it's time for planting.
