COMMUNITY HALL RENOVATION PROJECT MOVING FORWARD

Exciting improvements are coming to our Community Hall as we prepare to begin a major energy-efficiency and building renewal project this fall. The renovation design is now approximately 95% complete, with the project team currently finalizing details and obtaining necessary permits. Construction is expected to begin in late September or October.

The project includes several significant upgrades that will improve comfort, reduce energy consumption, and help ensure the hall continues to serve the community for many years to come. Planned improvements include:

- Replacement of the existing roof
- New insulation and air-sealing measures to reduce drafts and improve building comfort
- Replacement of the existing gas-fired heating systems with high-efficiency electric heat pumps
- Installation of a new solar photovoltaic array to generate clean, renewable electricity
- Accessibility improvements, including a barrier free washroom

Together, these upgrades will make the building more energy efficient, reduce operating costs, and improve year-round comfort for hall users.

The facility is expected to remain usable throughout most of the project, as much of the work is on the exterior of the building and within the mechanical and electrical rooms. Every effort will be made to maintain access for community events and programs.

We are committed to hosting a community meeting this fall when our detailed plan and budget is prepared.

We look forward to sharing more details as the project moves into construction and to delivering a more comfortable, sustainable, and resilient community gathering space for everyone to enjoy.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION AWARDS DONE DIFFERENTLY

Since time immemorial (or as long as I can remember), the NGCL has awarded volunteers for exemplary service. We seem to have always had a **Volunteer of the Year** award for some person(s) who accomplished far more than was typically expected in that year. And for the past two years, we have also had a **Lifetime Volunteer** award for the person(s) who has been a dedicated and committed League volunteer for two or more decades.

Our most recent awardee, **Don E.**, has had decades of League service as President (two different terms) and served in many other capacities. Such awards are presented at the Annual General Meeting.

Until now, the nomination as well as the selection of suitable candidates has rested with the Board, particularly Executive Committee. This year we want to do it differently and give you the chance to be involved in the nomination process.

The Board has formed a **Volunteer Appreciation Awards Committee** consisting of one Board member (**Natalia K.**) and two North Glenora residents. This Committee will be requesting nominations for both awards in the next newsletter, with a tentative deadline of December 31st; submission details will be included.

The City of Edmonton Police Department is encouraging everyone to display home addresses on back lane garages or fences. Displaying your back alley address is essential for emergency response, mail delivery, and waste collection.

- City Bylaw Compliance: Under the [City of Edmonton Addressing Bylaw](#), property owners are required to ensure addresses are visible. If your property has a laneway access or a detached garage, the number must be posted at the rear so it can be seen from the alley.

- Kennedale Eco Station** (Northeast): 5355 127 Avenue NW. Good for larger loads and metal, featuring a covered drop-off.
- Strathcona Eco Station** (South): 5150 99 Street NW.

Pedestrian Visibility and Safety

Residents are reminded that Parking is prohibited on or within 5 metres (16 feet) of a marked crosswalk, as per City of Edmonton Bylaw 5590. The 5-metre distance is measured from the near side of the marked crosswalk.
